Over the past sixteen years, the Missouri National Archery in the Schools Program (MoNASP) has grown exponentially to over 800 schools and 200,000 Missouri students in grades 4-12.

The MoNASP State Tournament has also seen tremendous growth and is now the **second largest state archery tournament in the nation**. Last year, was the largest yet! This four-day event had an **\$11 million economic impact in Branson seeing over 5,000 competitors and 24,000 spectators!**
